12 outstanding teams made it to the final round, evaluated by a distinguished panel of industry leaders and sustainability experts. The winning titles were awarded as follows:

- Best Integration of SDGs Christ University
- Best Overall Venture Shaheed Bhagat Singh College
- Most Scalable Idea Enactus SACE
- Audience Choice Award Enactus Shivaji College

In addition to the competition, Enactus CVS showcased its ongoing initiatives — Project Abyaan, Project Ehtiyaat, and Project Ikhtiraa — through dedicated interactive stalls. Attendees also participated in engaging sustainability-themed activities such as a pottery wheel, a book exchange drive, and a tote bag painting session, promoting hands-on learning and environmental consciousness.

Technophilia 6.0

The annual flagship event of Encrypt, the technical society of College of Vocational Studies, Technophilia 6.0 was conducted with great enthusiasm, innovation, and participation from students across disciplines. The event spanned across two days — April 8th and 9th, 2025 — and comprised a blend of online and offline activities designed to engage and inspire the student community.

Day 1: Online Events and Inaugural Webinar

Technophilia 6.0 was inaugurated on April 8th with an insightful **webinar** on the theme "**Being a Jack of All Trades is the Ultimate Superpower Today**", delivered by Ms. Ayusha Singh, Senior Associate at Cognizant. An alumna of IIM Rohtak and IIIT Jabalpur, Ms. Singh is a renowned career coach and educator with over 21,000 followers on Instagram. She has guided numerous young professionals in their career journeys and was recently a speaker at DevFest Noida 2024. Her session shed light on the value of versatility in today's dynamic professional landscape and encouraged students to explore diverse skillsets.

Following the webinar, two engaging online competitions were hosted:

Online Chess Competition: A test of strategy and focus, the online chess tournament brought together enthusiasts from various colleges. Participants engaged in intense battles of logic and foresight, making the event both intellectually stimulating and competitive.

Online Treasure Hunt – "The Portal Protocol": Designed to challenge problem-solving and lateral thinking, this solo-participation puzzle event took participants on a multiversal adventure through a series of thematic realms. Each level posed unique riddles and digital enigmas that tested wit and perseverance, making it one of the most appreciated events of the day.

Day 2: Offline Events and Technical Engagements

Topic - "Sustainable Resource Management and Community Rights: Glimpses from the Past"

PROFILE

Prof. Vipul Singh Department of history, Delhi University

Prof. Vipul Singh is a professor of environmental history in the Department of History at the University of Delhi. He is one of India's leading environmental historians. His research focuses on ecologically challenging regions of India, such as the arid landscapes of Western Rajasthan and the floodplains of the Ganga. He is also interested in topics like migration, inland fisheries, and how popular culture is reflected in folklore and vernacular literature.

Beyond the archives and lecture halls, Professor Singh's voice resonates in global forums, from the Ludwig Maximilians University in Munich, where he happened to be the Carson Fellow at the prestigious Rachel Carson Center for Environment and Society, to the International Consortium of Environmental History Organizations, where he was awarded for his continuous research on environmental history in 2019. He was also honored with the Best Teacher Award by the Delhi Government a few years ago.

His latest book, Speaking Rivers: Environmental History of a Mid-Ganga Flood Country (1540-1885), was published by Primus in 2018. He is currently working on a book project exploring the effects of global climate anomalies during the Mughal era. Additionally, he is studying the long-term environmental history of the Indian Ocean region and the impact of digital colonialism.

Prof. Singh serves on the editorial board of Water History, a journal published by Springer. He is also a Life Member of the Asian Association for Environmental History (AAEH).
